- Caring and responsive school community








## Addressing the Educational Needs of K-5 children

- A school that responds innovatively to the needs of all students



              - 8 Securing External Funding






## Partnership Schools: A Vision of the Classroom

#### **Spring Semester ~ 18 Students**




Student teacher—every day

## **Key Operational Points**

- A school of choice
- Students are low performing students OR students who have been attending a low performing school
- Operated by UNC Greensboro
  - Employees are UNCG employees who maintain state retirement and other benefits
  - UNCG's Chancellor is the school's executive officer
  - A ten person Advisory Board appointed by the Chancellor advises the Chancellor on the operations of the Partnership School
  - Funding comes from state ADM sources, local sources, federal sources, and external sources
- Released from some state regulations regarding the operation of schools

### **Opportunities**

- Close existing relationship between UNCG and Rockingham County
   Schools
- UNCG has the capacity in place to attract and receive external funding
- Creating educational and professional development programs and resources with area organizations and agencies
- Work with Rockingham County to engage local strengths and resources in service to teaching and learning in the schools
- UNCG faculty working with school and district personnel to foster equity and diversity and address educational problems of practice



## Things to Remember

- Moss Street Partnership School is a UNCG project, not just an SOE project
- Rockingham County Schools and UNCG will be full-fledged partners in this project. We are not using the term laboratory school to emphasize that this is a partnership
- The Partnership School creates a school space where faculty research is valued and research logistics are facilitated
- The Partnership School project is our opportunity to change the lives of high-needs students by giving them access to the opportunities they need to learn, to grow, to hope, to dream
