Tuition Guarantee (SB 873) (HB 1030)(G.S. 116-43.9) Highlights

- North Carolina General Assembly
 - The rate of Tuition for any freshman or transfer undergraduate student deemed to be a North Carolina resident will be guaranteed for the expected period to complete the course of study
 - Effective beginning with the Fall 2016 term
- UNC General Administration
 - Expanded the guarantee to apply to all currently enrolled undergraduates
 - No In-State Undergraduate Tuition Increases for Standard College Term



Tuition UNC System Policy, 2018-19

- No increase is allowed to resident students
- Nonresident undergraduate tuition should be market driven and reflect the full cost of providing nonresident students with a quality education.
- Graduate tuition shall continue to establish rates consistent with each program's unique market and academic requirements
- Tuition for graduate students will be set with an emphasis on maintaining and increasing excellence of the programs and ensuring access

Tuition

Tuition Rates for 2018-19 will be the same as 2017-18



Fees UNC System Policy, 2018-19

- Mandatory student fees are those charged to all students and approved by the Board of Governors
- A maximum of 3% increase to mandatory student fees
- Allocation of the increase may be distributed among the fee categories as needed

PROPOSAL: Fee Rates for 2018-19

Assess 3% increase on mandatory fees

• Fees would increase by \$81 per student or \$40.50 per semester, annual rates would change from \$2,716 to \$2,797

The funds will be used to purchase, repair, and update specialized video production, digital media equipment and technology, and software that are taught in and used in the instruction of upper division undergraduate Media Studies courses taken by majors only.

BOT – 5.1 Department of Kinesiology Sports and Exercise Psychology

New Fee \$200 per student credit hour
 Student credit hours: 120
 Generating additional \$24,000

Revenue will be used for specialized educational resources, professional development, travel reimbursement to clinical sites, support of enrolled graduate students assisting with program coordination and supervision, and to support the unusually heavy administrative workload associated with the program's supervised practical experiences.

BOT – 5.2 Department of Nutrition Dietetic Internship Program

\$200 per student credit hour
 Enrollment 180 student credit hours
 Generating \$ 36,000

The revenue will be used for program accreditation fees, support of qualified program faculty and preceptors, graduate student development and support, and program



BOT – 5.3 Department of Library and Information Studies

\$20 per student credit hour
 Enrollment 5,400 student credit hours
 Generating an additional \$ 108,000

The additional revenue will be used to purchase technology licenses, hire technology support personnel to support faculty and online students, and support online student retention and success initiatives, including graduate student stipends.



BOT – 5.4 Department of Management Master of Science in International Business

\$200 per student credit hour
 Enrollment 675 student credit hours
 Generating \$ 135,000

The additional revenue will be used to support crucial services and staffing expected in graduate business programs and to provide the additional technology and support needed for an online program.
