

What is an ERP?

Enterprise Resource Planning

Suite of integrated applications that rely on a shared database

Banner is UNCG's ERP system

- UNCG began using Ellucian's Banner suite of ERP software in 1997
- Banner 8.x is UNCG's system of record for institutional data
- Banner is the ERP System in use at all of the UNC system Schools except UNC-CH and NCSU

Why do we have to upgrade to Banner 9?

Banner 8.x

Administrative
Apps (INB)**

**Student, Faculty
And Staff
Self-Service
Apps (SSB)**

Oracle Database

INB applications will no longer function on December 31, 2018

SSB applications will no longer function on June 30, 2021

Bottom line: Every institution using Banner 8.x must transition to Banner 9 or something else. Banner 9 represents an entirely new web-based application platform for Ellucian.

Our approach

As-is Upgrade

- Import existing business processes, customizations, and data “as-is” into Banner 9



Not Sustainable

- Unnecessary customizations carried over to new system (costly to convert, more costly to maintain)
- Outdated business processes perpetuate operational inefficiencies and profoundly impact institutional data quality

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Do-Over

- Take advantage of the opportunity to collectively re-think our business processes and how we use our institutional data
- Eliminate unnecessary customizations - customize only for regulatory compliance or competitive edge
- Reduce institutional risk



Major Transformation

- Developing institutional readiness is projected to be a 24 – 36 month engagement.



What are the benefits and risks?

Benefits: Better service for our students

- Modern web-based, mobile experience
- More cost-effective value proposition
- Quality data that enables meaningful predictive analytics for student success

Risks: Quality of Implementation

- Complexity
- Resource Availability – internal and external
- Unexpected project delays
- Cost


What does this mean for the long-term?
