Tuition: Charged to partially defray the costs of general academic and administrative operations.




Fees: Charged only for dedicated purposes and shall not be used to defray the costs of general academic and administrative operations.

Athletics Fee

• Fee supports most costs of UNCG's Division I intercollegiate athletics program.

• Some costs are also met by ticket revenue and endowment income.





Education and Technology Fee

Education = academic course materials & supplies (such as lab equipment)





Technology = partial support of IT for student use; classroom technology, and ongoing refresh projects including band-width expansion



Health Fee



- Medical services
- Pharmacy
- Immunizations
- Lab/X-ray
- Psychiatry
- Counseling

- Wellness programs (nutrition, eating disorders, smoking cessation, etc.)
- Alcohol and drug programs



Facilities Fee

- Pays off the debt incurred on "capital projects" when student facilities are built or renovated—for example:
 - Soccer stadium
 - Student Recreation Center
 - Baseball stadium
 - EUC renovation
 - Student Health Center expansion/renovation

(Facilities fee does not include residence halls, dining or parking facilities; these are paid for by users.)



Security Fee

Implemented in 2015-16 by the Board of Governors to:

- Bring the law enforcement officers and emergency telecommunicators closer to the market rate
- Address some of the more urgent security concerns by funding a Title IX Coordinator, Clery Compliance Officer, and a Substance Abuse Counselor at each campus



Legislative/UNC System Guidance <u>TUITION</u>

General Assembly

- Allows increases for:
 - New Undergraduate Students
 - Non-Resident Students
 - Graduate Students
- Increases not allowed for:
 - Enrolled Undergraduate Students



Legislative/UNC System Guidance <u>TUITION</u>, continued

Board of Governors

- For <u>non-resident</u> students, requires market driven tuition prices, reflecting the full cost of a quality education
- For graduate programs, rates must be consistent with each program's unique market and academic requirements, with an emphasis on maintaining and increasing the excellence of the graduate programs

Legislative/UNC System Guidance STUDENT FEES

- General Assembly
 - Imposed a 3% cap on rate increases for General Student Fees
- Board of Governors
 - Defined General Fees as those considered by the Tuition and Fee Committee
 - Activities
 - Athletics
 - Health
 - Education & Technology
 - Security



Key Considerations

- Legislative Guidance
- Guidance provided by UNC System policy
- Tuition and fee rates compared to peers
- Institutional needs that could be addressed with tuition/fee revenue



How do UNCG's tuition and fee rates compare nationally?

Average in-state undergraduate tuition and fees at public universities was \$10,230 in 2018-19. The average rate increased to \$11,120 for in-state students at public doctoral universities, like UNCG.

• 3% Increase for all eligible

• Will generate \$754,000 per year



<u>Tuition Revenue Use</u>

- Student success initiatives (51.4% or \$387,359)
- Build graduate tuition waivers (28.1% or \$211,641)
- Faculty promotion and tenure (20.5% or \$155,000)



Fee Proposal

• 2.69% total increase on mandatory fees

• Fees would increase by \$77 per student annually, from \$2,866 to \$2,943
