




## 3-Year Funnel Comparison




**First Year Funnel**

Highest completed application total since 2019


11% YOY transfer enrollment increase as of 8/26/2024

\$300,000+ in transfer scholarships awarded annually


#### **Transfer Promise Partner Enrollment**





### Online Programs (All Careers)


Year over year change (%) in total enrollment compared to change in students in fully online programs.



- Topped out at approx. 16% Y/Y decline in FTIC packages awarded.


#### **Positive Pell Impact**




## Total New FTICs in UNC System (In-State)




### Increasing Market Share of Top Four

Number of HS Graduates decreasing by 2029 with anticipated market share of top four increasing from 45.6% in 2015 to 56.9% in 2029.






### Increase in Non-Consumers at UNCG

### **Dual Enrollment**

- Nationally, about 30% of high school students take part in dual enrollment (DE) coursework with colleges before graduation
- This would equate to more than 6,000 DE students in Guilford County. However, GTCC only serves about 1,500 DE students each year
- Pilot programs in the works with Guilford, Asheboro, and Alamance CS's (in partnership with SOE and iPie)
- The primary barrier to students is cost



Potential benefits: additional revenue stream and ability to bring prospective students to campus and into our academic community

### **Direct Admissions**

Full-scale programs in multiple states and also via major entities like CommonApp Studies show FTIC application increases but low enrollment impact

#### **NC College Connect**

- UNC System pilot Fall 2025, in partnership w/ NCDPI
- Proactive admissions offers to all qualified HS seniors in NC
- Five schools in pilot: ECSU, FSU, UNCG, UNCA, UNCP

#### **Choose NC**

- UNC-CH pilot to redirect applicants in case of denial
- Centralized data hub to import apps and materials
- Opportunity: In Fall 2023, UNC-CH rejected 47,000 applicants

#### **Community College**

- Pilot w/ GTCC and FTCC
- Proactive admit to qualifying assoc. degree completers
- Data sharing to remove barriers (app, fee, transcripts)
- In 2023, 2,600+ assoc. recipients, but only 900 transferred to UNC schools.

### **UNCG Education at Work Program**



The *Education at Work* program is designed to clarify and streamline the employer-to-university partnership, employee education pipeline, and employer return on investment for tuition assistance.

#### **Potential Program Benefits**

- Supplemental UNCG support and go-to points of contact for Triad-area employers investing in employee education
- Scholarship opportunities for adult learners
- A clear, straightforward admissions process for employees
- A streamlined, documented process for tuition assistance payment or reimbursement

- Delivery of outcomes data to primary employers to assist in gauging return on investment in tuition assistance and employee education
- Opportunity to give insight on future UNCG program and training development
- UNCG's low net cost helps your tuition assistance dollars do more
