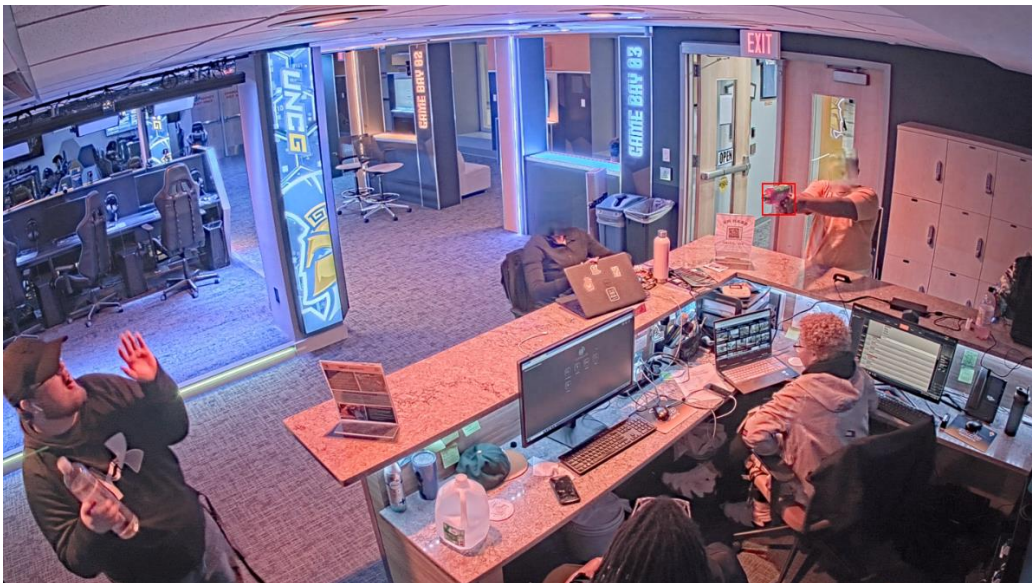


## POLICE UPDATE | April 2025

### ▪ ZeroEyes – Artificial Intelligence (AI) Weapon Detection

- *AI weapons detection platform that identifies visible guns through the existing security camera system on campus.*
- *Over 1,200 cameras on campus (500 are integrated with ZeroEyes)*
- *Statistics since implementation on March 28, 2024*
  - *True Positive Detections: 1*
  - *Law Enforcement Detections: 2*
  - *Non-Lethal/Toy Gun Detections: 15*

### True Positive Detection



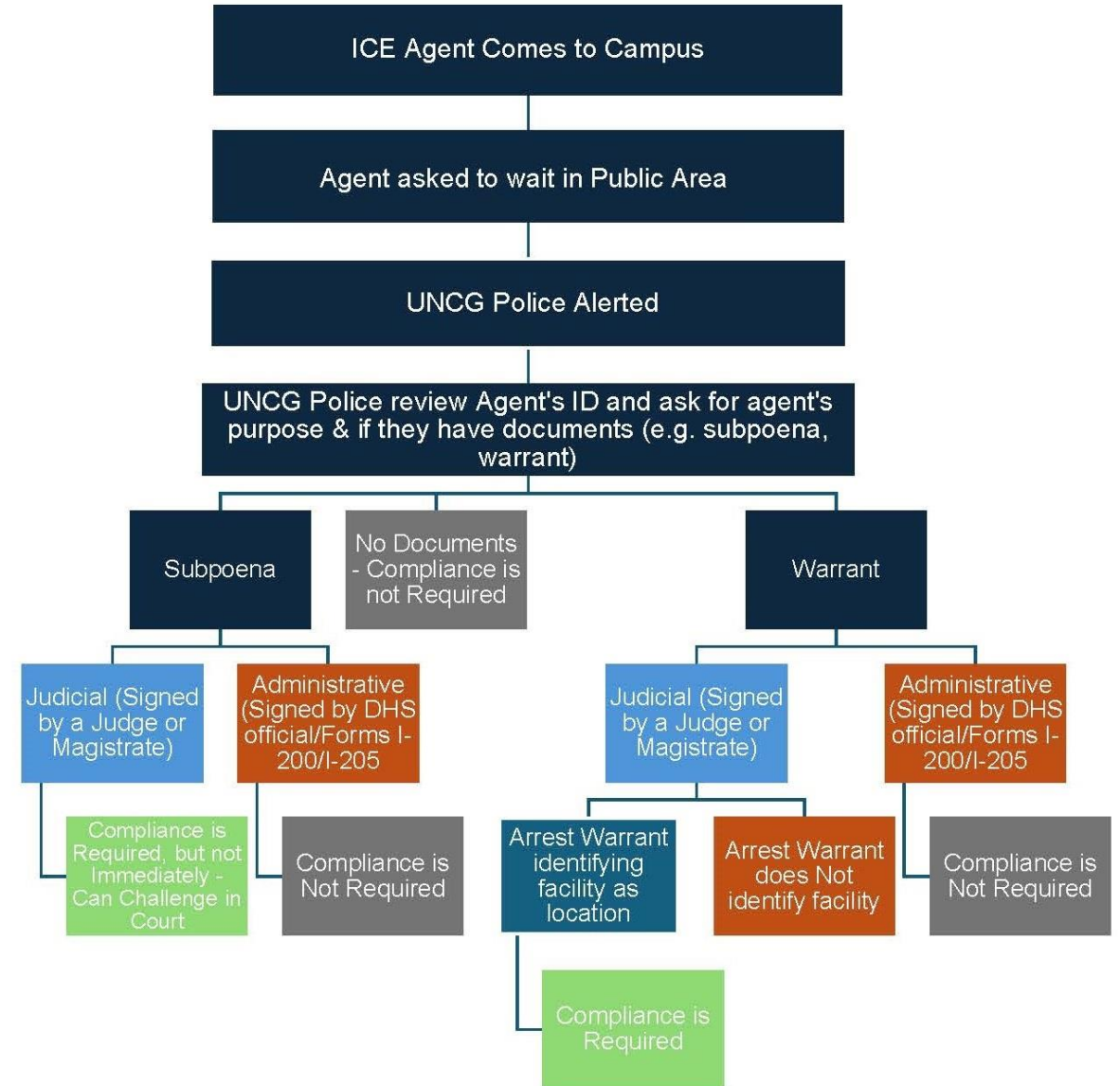
## POLICE UPDATE | April 2025

- **CALEA Accreditation Standard 84.1.6 (Evidence/Property Control System)**
  - *In order to maintain a high degree of evidentiary integrity over agency-controlled property and evidence, the UNCG Police Department conducts the following inspections, inventories, and audits:*
    - *Quarterly inspections of all property storage areas as well as associated records is conducted by the department's Evidence Technician*
    - *An unannounced inspection is conducted annually by the Chief or designee to ensure accountability and security of all property and records*
    - *An annual audit is conducted at the end of each fiscal year by the Professional Standards Unit*
    - *All evidence inspections and audits are submitted to the Chief of Police for review*
  - *The UNCG Police Department currently has 876 pieces of evidence in inventory*



## POLICE UPDATE | April 2025

- Information Requests from State and Federal Agents
  - These procedures have been in place all along and are the same ones used for even our local law enforcement partners*
  - All UNCG community members are asked to refer any inquiry from a federal or state agent regarding a student, faculty, or staff member to the UNCG Police Department.*
  - UNCG Police verifies credentials and any associated paperwork and then coordinates with necessary officers on campus.*
  - We protect student privacy based on FERPA and that includes locations such as residence halls.*
  - Judicial paperwork = Compliance*
  - Administrative paperwork = Compliance is not required*
